## Voter Information & Dates

Here are the answers to the most frequently asked questions about early voting in Kendall County.

Many places in this article will refer you to the Kendall County Clerk's Office, so let's give you that address right off the bat.

### What is the early voting period?

For the November 2, 2010 general election, the early voting in Kendall County begins on October 12, 2010 and ends on October 28, 2010.

### Where do I cast an early ballot?

Between these dates, registered voters in Kendall County may cast their ballot during regular business hours (Mon. through Fri. 8:00AM – 4:30PM) at the Kendall County Clerks Office 111 W. Fox St. - Room 220

Yorkville IL 60560

Please note that this address is for early voting only. If you wish to cast your ballot on Election Day, you must do so at your regular polling place. A list of polling places is available at [www.kendall-democrats.org](http://www.kendall-democrats.org).

### What if I'm not registered yet?

The Democratic Central Committee recommends all voters register by the close of regular registration. Regular registration closes on October 5, 2010. Until then, people may register at their city or village offices, their local library, or at the County Clerks office. In addition, both major political parties have deputy registrars on staff. Either party will be happy to send someone to your home to register voters - but only if it's done by October 5, 2010.

### What if I'm not registered by the 2nd?

That's where Grace Period Registration comes in. Individuals who were unable to register or change their address prior to the close of regular registration (28 days prior to an election) may now register up to 14 days prior to the election. This

can only be done at the County Clerks Office. For this November's general election, the grace period is from October 6, 2010 to October 26, 2010. Voters who register during the registration grace period must cast their ballot at the same time. They will not be permitted to cast a ballot at their regular polling place on Election Day.

### Will I need to bring I.D.?

Yes. A photo I.D. bearing your current address will be required whether you are registering, voting or both. A drivers license or State I.D. card are preferred. If you have neither, contact the County Clerks offices to see what other forms of I.D. are acceptable.

### Does this replace Absentee Ballots?

No. Absentee ballots are still available Absentee ballots are collected by mail. Contact the County Clerk if you would like to be sent an Absentee ballot. If you have any questions that haven't been addressed here, you can contact the Kendall County Clerks Office at the address above.

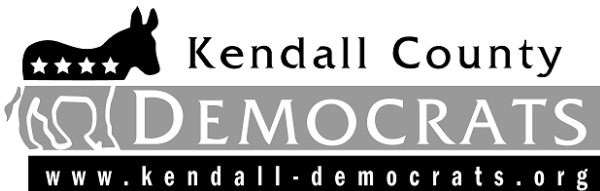
